Introduction to Evacuations (EM 150)

The Need

All healthcare facilities are at risk for incidents that lead to partial or full evacuations, from water pipe breaks to fires to natural disasters to human-made incidents. To ensure the safety of patients and staff, personnel at all levels within an organization must be trained on key concepts to prepare them for their role in a facility evacuation.
