

\$100M FY19 Budget


- \$56M -Prevention, Treatment and Recovery

Expanding access to medicinal marijuana



- **21,000** patients
 - Increase of 5,000 since new administration began
- 600 physicians
- 900 caregivers



Medicinal Marijuana as Treatment: Opioids



In States with Medicinal Marijuana Programs (compared to states without):

- 5.88% lower rate of opioid prescribing (Bradford, et al. *JAMA Int. Med.* 2018)
- 3.742 million fewer daily doses filled (Bradford, et al. *JAMA Int. Med.* 2018)
- 24.8% lower mean annual opioid overdose mortality rate (Bachhuber, et al. *JAMA Int. Med.* 2014)
- And importantly... the association strengthens with program expansion



Access to Care: End-of-Life Planning

- 6 out of 10 NJ adult residents have no written documents expressing their wishes for end-of-life care
- 38% of NJ adult residents have not had conversations about advance care planning



The Case for Providers and Hospitals



This is the main policy hurdle! (NOT technology...)

Disincentives:

- IT investment can be costly
- High operational transition costs (process changes, staff retraining)
- "Patient retention" remains a strong inventive.

Incentives:

- Manual record transfers consume staff time, creates inefficiency
- Interoperability facilitates automated quality reporting
